Keep on learning.

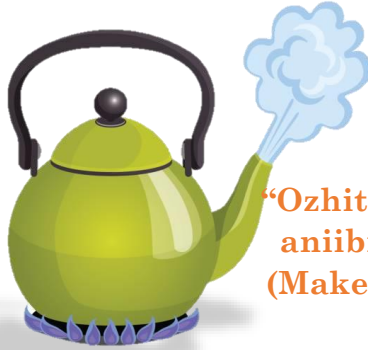
